Happy New Year, Voyager Residents and Guests!

The new season brings a few changes to our pet policy at Voyager. Being all pet friendly is great, but I wanted to let you know some hints on how to enjoy our space with everyone, as some areas are not open to all pets. As we adapt and make positive changes for pet owners, we wanted to remind everyone that there are also residents who enjoy their peaceful space without pets. There are plentiful areas for our four-legged friends to play and exercise. We have built dedicated dog runs to accommodate our dogs and their owners. It is also only fair that we maintain areas in the resort that cater to those seeking a quiet area without pets. We hope that you appreciate the balance we are trying to create so that all residents and dogs can enjoy our resort. There are also safety and health considerations that restrict areas for pets. Finally, we would like to remind everyone that service and assistance animals are allowed to accompany their owners in most areas that their owners go with certain restrictions, as set forth in applicable laws. Please contact management with any questions or concerns regarding service or assistance animals.

Below is a simple outline of areas pets are permitted and not permitted. We appreciate your support as we create a place where everyone can engage in the peaceful enjoyment of our resort.

Places pet dogs are welcome to enjoy (outside of the fenced-in dog runs, all pets MUST be on a leash at ALL TIMES)

- Specifically identified Dog Runs (please see front desk for map of fenced dog run areas both at the Bay and in the wash)
- Getting your mail (dogs must be on leash at all times. Please no loitering with dogs in the mail breezeway. This is for your convenience as you are between home and dog friendly areas)
- All outdoor pedestrian walking paths and streets (outside the inner courtyard)

Places pet dogs are prohibited:

- Pools both indoor and outdoor
- No pets on the courtyard or grassy areas
- Inside any building
- Golf course and Pro Shop
- Hotel and Designated Casitas and Park Models

Remember as a courtesy to all please continue to pick-up after your pets.

If you have any questions at all, please let us know. We want pet owners and non-pet owners and those with service or assistance animals to enjoy our resort in their preferred ways. We hope that providing places where pets are allowed and restricted will allow ALL residents the opportunity to enjoy all that Voyager has to offer.

Golf News



Monthly Courtesy Patrol News

Residents are allowed no more than three (3) pets per home site and pets must always be leashed with a maximum 6 (six) foot lead while outside, retractable or otherwise adjustable leashes are prohibited.

Please be respectful when walking your pets. Pets must be attended at all times when outside the home.

Noisy and unruly pets or pets that receive frequent complaints will, at the discretion of Management, be cause for removal from Voyager. Any pet which exhibits aggressive behavior, or which threatens or attacks a person, or another pet must be removed from the Resort immediately.

Pet owners cannot utilize vacant lots for their pet to relieve itself. Not cleaning up after your pet is not only a violation of Voyager Rules but of Pima County Code 6.04.030 (E). Unattended pets are not permitted at any time. For the safety of yourself and your pet, pet owners or their guests may not have pets in tow while riding a bicycle or driving any motorized vehicle.

If you are leaving your pets at home, please take in to consideration having them situated as to not be barking at passing residents and vehicles.
